Missions Area: Texas

Laredo, Texas, is located on the United States border with Mexico. The Rio Grande River separates Laredo on the US side from Nuevo Laredo on the Mexico side. Many people cross the bridges over the river for work, shopping, and entertainment, often waiting hours to cross. Approximately 95 percent of the population is Hispanic. At various times in its history, Laredo has belonged to Spain, France, Mexico, the Republic of Texas, its own republic, and the US. The city has become a blend of Mexican and American cultures.

Laredo is the largest and oldest port of entry between the US and Mexico. About 1,400 trucks cross the border at Laredo each day bringing goods to the US.

The southern Texas climate is hot and dry. In the summer, temperatures can hover around 100 degrees Fahrenheit. Mr. Lerma says the heat can make ministry difficult as volunteers try to adjust to being out in it.

Laredo has a high poverty rate, high unemployment, low educational opportunities, reduced access to health care, and other factors that are found in high poverty areas. Food insecurity is extremely high. The Send Relief Mission Center of Laredo seeks to help those affected by these issues. They are especially working to strengthen families and serve children who are at risk.
