The Johnsons live in a bustling city of 10 million in Southeast Asia. There are seven million motorbikes in the city! The sounds of motorcycles and trains mixed with people going about their everyday lives on the busy streets—with occasional drums and cymbals used to celebrate—makes for a noisy place to live. But, when the Johnsons walk into an alleyway where their home is located, it is peaceful and quiet.

Because the people of Southeast Asia follow several different religions, often at the same time, it is difficult for them to understand that there is only one True God. They may want to follow Jesus but not be willing to give up other religious practices.
