



Free Sample Activity



Each leader needs one *GA Journey Leader Guide*, which correlates with all six member books.

Each GA uses a book based on her grade level for individual work and recording her accomplishments.



For GAs in grade 4

When you send girls on the GA Journey, you are sending them on a path of individual discovery and personalized learning. Through journaling, Bible learning and unique activities, girls will see their creativity grow and their faith deepen.

GA Journey can be used on its own or during regular Girls in Action meetings. Many activities require a GA leader or parent to lead them.

Leaders can choose activities from the leader guide or work with each girl to choose activities. Girls may earn badges and stars when they complete each activity. When all eight activities are finished, the leader awards a certificate of completion.

Room-to-Room Display

What You Need:

- Sheets of poster board
- Markers
- Poster putty or double-stick poster tape
- GA World and other missions magazines (recent issues)
- Computer with Internet access (optional)

What You Do:

- ☆ Say: *One way we can support missionaries is by informing people in our church about missionary needs and prayer requests.*
- ☆ As an added option and with close supervision, allow GAs to search for information about missionaries online.
- ☆ Help GAs make a "Room-to-Room Display" by placing posters in church classrooms. Talk with church staff or teachers about your intentions.

What GAs Do:
 Inform people in your church about selected missionaries and their needs by creating a poster display in a church classroom.

1. Search recent missions magazines such as *GA World* or do an online search for the names of Southern Baptist missionaries, the places where they serve, and their prayer requests and/or needs. Go to www.namb.net and www.imb.org for information.
2. Make a poster to inform people in the church of the missionary information you discovered.
3. Ask your leader where you can display your poster in the church.
4. Complete pages 19-22 in your GA Journey activity book. See following pages.

Flip Calendar

What You Need:

- Bibles
- Bible dictionary
- Recent missions magazines
- Heavyweight paper
- Pencils
- Scissors
- Markers
- Cups (1 per girl)
- Notebook rings

What You Do:

- ☆ Provide a stack of recent missions magazines such as *GA World*, and/or print out missionary information and prayer requests from www.imb.org or www.namb.net.
- ☆ Talk about how missionaries are *witnesses* and how GAs can be *witnesses* for Christ.

What GAs Do:
 Make a flip calendar to use as a prayer guide during the upcoming week.

1. Find and read Matthew 28:19 in your Bible.
2. Find and read the definition of the word *witness* in a Bible dictionary.
3. Place the top of a cup on a sheet of paper. Trace around it. Move it to another spot on the paper and trace around it again. Continue to repeat this step until you have seven circles.
4. Cut out each circle.
5. Write a day of the week on top of each circle.
6. Write a missionary's name and a prayer request on each circle. Search through missions magazines for information.
7. Stack the circles in order. Punch a hole through the top of the stack. Insert and secure a notebook ring through the hole.
8. Pray each day this week for a missionary and a request.
9. Complete pages 19-22 in your GA Journey activity book. See following pages.



❖ Ask your leader to help you find the name of a missionary serving in your state. Write a letter to the missionary asking how your GA group can help him or her.




Each of the eight growth areas ends with a "Keep Going" idea.
