Bible Focus

In Luke 8:43–48, a woman suffered because of a 12-year chronic health issue. She reached out to Jesus, literally, by touching the edge of His cloak. Instantly, she was healed. Jesus gave her the opportunity to share her story with everyone. Pray for any family members and friends with health problems to find healing and recovery.

Ministry Focus

John* and Sara Fenton* face security concerns where they serve. The government does not permit missionaries and even tries to shut down or control the local churches. The local believers face persecution and threats.

Missions Focus

▶▶▶ Get Well Soon

Be inspired by the hope of the woman featured in Luke 8:43–48. As a family, prepare a care package and/or meal for someone who is recovering from illness. Include practical items as well as flowers or balloons. Create an original get-well-soon card. Pray for the sick person and his or her caregivers.

▶▶▶ Family-Style Take Out

The Fenton family has learned to be adventurous in their eating. As a family, visit a restaurant that serves food from a country in the Asian Pacific Rim. Sample at least one food you have never tried together. Thank God for your food and the all hands that prepared this meal – from the farm to the table.

▶▶▶ Virtual Family Prayer Walk

Visit imb.org and search for Asian Pacific Rim. Look at photographs together and read stories about how God is working in the lives of the people that live there. Praise God for the faithful believers who are sharing the gospel story even though it is very difficult and even dangerous for them.
