

#### Who is WMU?

If you know of Woman's Missionary Union (WMU), you likely have experience with the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering and the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering or one of our groups like Women on Mission, Royal Ambassadors (RAs), Girls in Action (GAs), and Mission Friends. And if you haven't met us yet, let us introduce ourselves: since 1888, WMU has been serving Southern Baptist Convention churches and providing ways for those churches to cooperate together to accomplish the Great Commission.

When Lottie Moon wrote Annie Armstrong urging her to help raise funds for missionaries, something special began. For more than 135 years, we have created resources that equip small groups in local churches to keep the Great Commission front and center. Our resources do this by helping

the local church learn about missions, pray for missions, support missions, and do missions and tell others about Jesus, ultimately making disciples of Jesus who live on mission.

Imagine small groups of all age levels meeting in your church throughout the week, hearing the accounts of our North American Mission Board (NAMB) and International Mission Board (IMB) missionaries and, then, having the opportunity to partner with these same missionaries through prayer and support. Imagine every person in every group partnering with missionaries to proclaim the gospel to the ends of the earth. How would that kind of discipleship transform the heart of a believer and the priorities of a local church? The answer to that question is our "why"—it's who we are and what we do.



## Why missions discipleship? Because it is biblical.

WMU's missions discipleship curriculum follows the example of cooperation from the church in Acts and, thus, works to equip every Southern Baptist church, no matter the size or location, to participate in sending and supporting missionaries.

We help every age level in your church stay connected to the story and work of our missionaries. And when churches regularly hear from and learn from our missionaries, they are also equipped to stay on mission at home.

# Why missions discipleship? Because it is the link between the Cooperative Program and our missions agencies.


WMU's missions discipleship curriculum keeps the faces and names of NAMB and IMB missionaries in front of our churches throughout the year. It helps our churches remember that we are not giving to a program but to our brothers and sisters who have

answered the call to missions. And connecting our giving to the brothers and sisters it supports increases our generosity.

The book of Acts is filled with stories of generous believers who sacrificed much to support the mission of Jesus. And WMU's missions discipleship curriculum creates the kind of relationships and partnerships that send and keep our missionaries on the field.

### Why missions discipleship? Because it prioritizes the mission.

WMU's missions discipleship curriculum is all about equipping every member of the local church to obey his or her part in accomplishing the Great Commission. Instead of assuming that "some of us" will go and make disciples, WMU's missions discipleship curriculum gives every small group in your church the opportunity to support missions, raise up the next generation of missionaries, and faithfully evangelize and disciple in your context.



### WMU missions groups teach the local church about missions.

Consistent exposure to the stories of missionaries and the places they serve slowly but surely shapes the worldview of our people and the culture of our churches. Our age-graded, coordinated curriculum teaches preschoolers to senior adults what missions is, how to share their faith in age-appropriate ways, and the importance of the church working for the mission together. Churches with WMU groups learn together so that they can pray, support, and do missions together.

# WMU missions groups motivate the local church to pray for missions.

WMU missions groups take time in each gathering to pray for missionaries by name, to pray for the work of the North American Mission Board and International Mission Board, and to pray for their churches and local missions projects. WMU's Missions Mosaic magazine has a daily prayer feature, because we believe the church needs to

pray daily for missions to the neighborhoods and the nations. Churches that pray together stay on mission together.

### WMU missions groups support missions and the work of the church generously.

When our people devote themselves to prayer for the mission, God often softens our hearts for the mission and makes us generous with our finances. This is why WMU missions groups get excited to support the work of the local church and missionaries all over the world.

#### WMU missions groups do missions.

Because WMU missions groups have learned about missions, prayed for missions, and given to missions, they are committed to working together to do missions. Men and women, boys and girls, partner together to reach their neighborhoods, to feed the hungry, to comfort the afflicted, to bring the good news to the ends of the earth. This is Great

Commission living: a church that is mobilized for action and ready to partner with its pastor to take the good news to everyone.

#### WMU missions groups make disciples.

Because the church is living on mission together, making disciples becomes a natural occurrence. Discipleship in its simplest form is "as we go," living out Deuteronomy 6:6–7. It's walking together, exactly how Jesus took the disciples with Him. Whatever He was doing, they did. That's why discipleship is a natural outflow of WMU missions groups.

### WMU missions groups raise up and call out missionaries.

Countless NAMB and IMB missionaries credit RAs and GAs with planting the seed that God grew into the call to missions. If we want to tackle the problem of lostness in the world, we must be intentional about discipling our people to consider the call of missions. WMU missions groups do just that.

## WMU missions groups increase cooperation and partnership.

WMU missions groups provide opportunities year-round to partner with NAMB missionaries (Christmas in August), IMB, and other Baptist churches in your association. WMU missions groups often become the biggest supporters of your church's missions trips too.

# WMU missions groups highlight the best of Baptist distinctives.

Our groups model that Scripture is our final and highest authority. We take our missions

methodology straight from Acts—small groups of men and women doing whatever it takes to follow Jesus and support the mission. Our curriculum believes in the autonomy of the local church. We provide everything your church needs to get started on mission, but the real beauty happens when your people contribute to the mission in the ways that your church is uniquely gifted. And, finally, WMU missions groups are a direct application of the priesthood of all believers. Our curriculum equips every member of your church to find his or her role in accomplishing the Great Commission.

#### WMU is a friend to the local church.

We have partnered with the church since 1888. Pastors love WMU missions groups because rather than adding to their already busy schedule, our groups help them achieve their goals for evangelism, discipleship, and missions in the congregation. We are here to help.

# WMU missions groups keep the Great Commission front and center in the life of the church.

Each of our churches has been called to obey Jesus' Great Commission from Matthew 28:18–20. Ultimately, WMU missions groups remind our people throughout the year that the mission is urgent and must be prioritized. 




