
Mission Friends® serves preschool boys and girls (birth through kindergarten). Through Mission Friends, preschoolers

Helping Others Activities

Threes and Fours will collect water bottles, add labels telling of Jesus' love, and give them out when they go with their families to a local sporting event. See Session 2.

Kindergarten will make cards inviting people to church and fill snack bags to give out when they visit a park with their families. See Session 4.

Jason and Cassie Harris serve the people in Paris, France as they focus on planting churches (starting new churches) throughout the city. Since most people in France speak French, the entire family needed to learn to speak French. It took Mr. Harris about a year to learn French, while Mrs. Harris is still learning the language.

Mr. Harris is a team leader who works with the other missionaries who live in the city to start new churches. Mrs. Harris helps in many ways and spends time with the people who live in Paris.

The 2024 Summer Olympics were just held in Paris. Mr. and Mrs. Harris were involved in outreach activities during the Olympics such as Olympic pin trading, giving out water bottles, street art, music, and sharing the gospel in areas they hope to start new churches.

The Harrises have four children: Kerah (14), Jude (11), Silas (9), and Ethne (3). Their children help by inviting other children to join them for art projects, passing out water bottles, and trying to have conversations about Jesus with their friends at school.

Outcomes

Babies, ones, and twos will learn that missionaries tell people about Jesus. They will hear about missionaries Jason and Cassie Harris.

Bible Thoughts

Jesus had friends (see Luke 2:52). Love one another (see 1 John 4:7). (hoose a few activities each week. Babies, ones, and twos love repetition!

A longer version of the story is provided for kindergartners.

Activities

Make Bread with Play Dough

Post the allergy alert chart. Show how to roll, pat, and shape play dough into loaf shapes. Talk about the baguettes people eat in France where Jason and Cassie Harris live. Sing "Missionaries Go," page 34. Show Pictures 1-4.

Taste Baguettes and Butter

Post the allergy alert chart. Serve baguettes with butter for ones and twos to taste. Say: Missionaries Jason and Cassie see people carrying baguettes in Paris. People in Paris eat baguettes.

Give babies age-appropriate biscuits to taste.

Read a Book

In advance, prepare kit item 2, "Tell People About Jesus."

Sing "Missionaries Tell," page 35. Picture read *Around the World*. Share about the Paris Summer Olypmics. Say: Many people went to Paris for the Olympics. The Harrises told people they met about Jesus.

Open the Bible and read: Jesus had friends (see Luke 2:52).

Enjoy a Café

Set out toy dishes, tea pot, and cups for ones and twos to pretend to have tea with friends. Say: Jason and Cassie love their friends. They enjoy having coffee with friends at cafés.

Open the Bible and read: Love one another (see 1 John 4:7).

Work Puzzles About Jesus

In advance, prepare kit item 1, "Bible Thought Fun." Add Bible markers to the Bible.

Let ones and twos toss the cube. Say Bible thoughts from the cube as babies pull markers from the Bible. As preschoolers work puzzles about Jesus, share that missionaries tell people about Jesus.

Open the Bible and read: Jesus had friends (see Luke 2:52).

Paint with Daubers

Set up white paper with two colors of paint daubers. Provide paint smocks. Show ones and twos how to dot the paper. Say: Missionary Cassie loves to paint. She invites ladies to her home to paint and tells them about Jesus.

Beach Ball Olympics

Invite ones and twos to toss and catch beach balls. Let a baby hold a beach ball. Say: Missionary Jason and his helpers met people at the Olympics, traded Olympic pins, gave out water bottles, and told people about Jesus.

Outcomes

Preschoolers will meet Jason and Cassie Harris, missionaries in Paris, France. Focusing on the concept of world, preschoolers will learn missionaries tell people around the world about God and Jesus.

Activities

ART—Easel Painting

In advance, prepare tempera paint and easel.

Have preschoolers wear aprons as they easel paint. Say: The Harrises had art in the park for children. The missionaries met new families they could tell about God and Jesus.

BLOCKS—Build Towers

In advance, search online for pictures of the Eiffel Tower.

Show the pictures. Encourage preschoolers to create their own unique towers with blocks. Say: Jason and Cassie Harris are missionaries in Paris, France.

BOOKS—Around the World

In advance, tape pictures of multicultural people on the globe.

Read Around the World. Guide preschoolers to gently spin the globe to find a picture. Say: Missionaries tell people around the world about God and Jesus.

HOMELIVING—Sidewalk Café

In advance, prepare kit item 7, "French Food." Arrange tables side-by-side to resemble sidewalk café tables.

Invite preschoolers to serve customers pretend coffee and French food. Say: People in France like to drink coffee, eat meals, and talk to friends at sidewalk cafés. The Harrises show love to the friends they meet.

Open the Bible and read: Love one another (see 1 John 4:7).

MUSIC AND MOVEMENT—Go and Tell

Discuss Picture 1. Name the family members. Sing "What Missionaries Do," page 34, substituting "Paris, France" and "Harrises." Say: Missionaries tell people around the world about God and Jesus. Who can we tell?

NATURE—Nature Items

Post the allergy alert chart. Ask preschoolers to share about times they've gone to a park as they explore nature items that could be found in a park. Say: Going to the park is one way the Harrises meet other families.

PUZZLES AND MANIPULATIVES—Tour Paris

In advance, prepare kit item 5, "Tour Paris." Make a large painter's tape loop on the floor. Tape picture cards on the loop.

Read a sentence card. Invite a preschooler to drive a toy bus to the matching picture. Continue with other pictures. Say: The Harrises meet people in Paris who need to hear about God and Jesus.

Outcomes

Kindergartners will learn about Jason and Cassie Harris, missionaries in Paris, France. Focusing on the concept of **world**, kindergartners will hear that missionaries tell people in other countries about Jesus.

Activities

ART—Art Museum

Discuss what kindergartners could see in a museum. Guide them to create collages with paper and craft supplies. Frame, label, and display the art for others to see. Say: The Louvre is a famous art museum in Paris. Jason and Cassie Harris are missionaries in Paris, France.

Tip: See sketch on page 21.

BLOCKS—Paris Buildings

Show pictures of Paris. Encourage kindergartners to use blocks to create buildings that could be found in Paris. Say: The Harrises moved to Paris to tell people in other countries about Jesus.

BOOKS—Mr. Harris

Discuss Picture 2. Picture read books about France and the Summer Olympics. Let kindergartners use toy telephones to pretend to call people to plan for the Olympics. Say: Mr. Harris plans with churches in France and other countries to find ways to share about Jesus. He did a lot of planning for the Summer Olympics.

HOMELIVING—Taste Brie and Baguettes

Post the allergy alert chart. Show the whole cheese and bread. Serve kindergartners a slice of baguette with some brie to taste. Say: Many French farmers make brie and bakeries make baguettes. The Harrises like baguettes so much they named their cat Baguette!

Caution: Keep knife away from kindergartners.

MUSIC AND MOVEMENT—Summer Sports

Sing "This Is the Way I Like to Move," page 25, encouraging kindergartners to move like athletes training for summer sports. Say: Athletes and visitors were in Paris for the Summer Olympics. The Harrises worked with others to tell people who came to the Olympics about Jesus.

NATURE—Paris Parks

In advance, search online for pictures of Paris parks.

Discuss things kindergartners see in the park pictures. Say: Families in Paris visit city parks. The Harrises visit parks and make new friends there. What do you like to do when you visit a park?

Open the Bible and read: A friend loves at all times (see Prov. 17:17).

PUZZLES AND MANIPULATIVES—Paris Missionaries

In advance, prepare kit item 18, "Three-in-a-Row."

Read calling cards and let kindergartners place buttons on top of matching pictures on their cards to get three in a row. Say: The Harrises are missionaries in Paris.

Group Time Tip:

In advance, search online for pictures of Paris, including city parks.

Introduction

Show Picture 1 and pictures of Paris. Name family members (clockwise beginning with Mr. Harris: Jason, Cassie, Silas, Ethne, Jude, Kerah). Say: Listen to hear a way the missionaries meet new people.

Tell the Story

Art in the Park

The Harris family walked along the busy sidewalk. They could smell freshly baked bread. "Delicious baquettes," sighed Cassie Harris, sniffing the air.

They saw people sitting at cafés, visiting, and sipping coffee. "I love having coffee with friends, " said Jason Harris.

"There's the park," shouted Kerah.

"Art in the park!" said Jude.

"Mom, I am glad you are an artist so we can do art in the park," said Silas.

Mrs. Harris put Ethne down to walk. "Teaching art in the park is a great way to meet new people," she said.

"Go find some friends to come and do art," said Mr. Harris. "I will help set up supplies."

The Harris children raced to invite children to do art. "Our mom is an artist!" said Silas. "Come and do art with us!" Several children and their parents followed the Harris children to a picnic table.

A mission story is

provided for each session.

"Bonjour [BONE-zhur]! Hello!" said Mrs. Harris.

The children were soon drawing things they saw at the park.

"I love to draw things that God created," said Jude. "Animals are my favorite."

"I like to draw rainbows," said a young girl.

Mr. Harris visited with the parents and introduced his family. "We live in a nearby apartment," he shared. "We love coming to this park."

"We live nearby too," said one man. "Maybe we will see you at the park again sometime."

"I hope so," said a smiling Mr. Harris.

Stop here for Threes and Fours.

Ask: Why did the Harrises go to the park? What do you like to do at a park? (Go to Prayertime below.)

Mrs. Harris heard the girl mention the rainbow. "There is a story in the Bible about the rainbow," she said.

Kerah excitedly told the girl the story of Noah, the ark, and God's promise.

Mr. Harris listened, and then asked, "What do you do on Sundays?"

"We usually sleep late and then enjoy breakfast," said one dad.

Outcomes

Preschoolers will hear that French people are important to Mr. and Mrs. Harris. Focusing on the concept of **world**, they will hear God showed everyone His love by sending Jesus to the world.

Activities

Provide both active and quiet activities for preschoolers to choose from.

ART—Draw French Houses

In advance, search online for pictures of Paris French houses and apartments. Show pictures, pointing out shutters and balconies. Provide markers so preschoolers can draw a French house on a manila folder. Open the folders and help preschoolers stand the houses beside each other. Say: French people are important to the Harrises. They invite people to their home to learn about God's love.

Tip: See sketch on page 21.

BLOCKS—Train Travel

Encourage preschoolers to build tracks and roads for people figures. Say: Many people ride a train to get to Paris and get around Paris. The people in France are important to the Harrises.

BOOKS—God Loves People

Discuss Picture 3. Read *Always Remember to Pray*. Say: The Harrises want people in Paris to go to church. We can pray for people to want to learn that God showed His love by sending Jesus to the world.

Pray together.

HOMELIVING—Go Shopping

In advance, arrange a market with baskets of play food and flowers. Make baguettes by twisting newspaper into a baguette shape and wrapping it with masking tape.

Provide play money and tote bags for preschoolers to shop. Say: The Harrises shop at markets for freshly baked goods like baguettes. The Harrises live in Paris because the people are important to them.

Tip: See sketch on page 21.

MUSIC AND MOVEMENT—Name the Sport

Use kit item 6, "Olympic Sports Puzzles." Invite preschoolers to work puzzles and then act out the sports. Say: God showed His love by sending Jesus to all the world—to everyone at the Olympics and everyone around the world.

NATURE—Fresh Flowers

Post the allergy alert chart. Let preschoolers smell and touch the flowers. Say: People buy fresh flowers at Paris markets. People in France are important to Mr. and Mrs. Harris.

PUZZLES AND MANIPULATIVES—Play Dough Cookies

Post the allergy alert chart. Set out play dough, rolling pins, and cookie cutters for preschoolers to make play dough cookies. Say: Mrs. Harris made cookies to share at the park with neighbors and their children. French people are important to Mrs. Harris.


