

A Floating House in Brazil

This month, preschoolers are learning about Don and Maria Friesen, missionaries in Brazil. For security reasons, the Friesens call their people group the M people. To be close to the M people, the Friesens live in a floating house on the Amazon River. This allows them to live in the same community as the M people and move to a new location as needed to follow the M people when they move their cattle to dry pastures. The Friesens started a church for the M people to attend.

Create a Floating House

Supplies: blocks, blue towel, green towel, aluminum foil or metal cake pan, people figures, plastic toy cows, Bible

- 1. Help spread a blue towel to resemble the Amazon River. Let your child spread the green towel pasture beside it and stand toy cows on top.
- 2. Play with your child as she builds a block home inside the cake pan for the people figures.
- 3. Work together to gently push the "floating home" along the river. Share that the Friesens live in a floating house that moves so they can follow the M people when they move their cows to dry pastures!
- 4. **Open the Bible and read:** Pray for one another (see James 5:16). Say simple prayers for the Friesens as you play with your child.
